We are working toward a future when all students have access to the health services they need to be successful in school. School-based health care includes programs such as school nurses, comprehensive school-based health centers (SBHCs), mental health care services, and dental programs.

In California, more than 265,000 children grades K-12 attend a school that has a health center, and many more have access to other types of school-based health care services. This is an important start, but many more school-based health centers are needed, particularly in underserved communities.

Successful Students. Healthy students miss fewer classes, are less likely to drop out, and have a better chance of success in school and beyond.
